



Joint Communication Platform (JCP)

FACT SHEET

Mission

The JCP provides military and commercial access at the Incident Command Site by providing internet access, IP telephone service, video conferencing, and bridging high-frequency military and civilian radio systems.



Notes

- The Minnesota National Guard has two JCP trailers. Both trailers are currently deployed to the Red River Valley in support of Flood Fight 2009.
- A JCP trailer can provide voice, video and data connectivity to the public and to the Minnesota National Guard Network.
- Is designed to provide on-site and reach-back communications capabilities for enhanced command and control.
- A JCP also provides shared situational awareness among first responders, state and federal agencies, command authorities and centers.
- The JCP improves interoperability, which helps public safety service and support providers – law enforcement, firefighters, EMS, emergency management, public utilities, transportation and others, to communicate with staff from other responding agencies in real time.
- Entered service in 2006
- Fully Mission Capable in 15 minutes with 3 man crew from arrival on site
- Towed by 5-Ton FMTV or civilian equivalent
- Diesel-Powered
- Climate controlled and directional lighting
- Loaded with multi-function color copier/scanner/printer
