The word "basic branch" means those commissioned officer branches available in Minnesota Army National Guard units that DO NOT require specialized civilian training before appointment. Generally, attendance at an officer candidate school is required for initial appointment in a basic branch. Direct commissions are available in the basic branches if applicant meets specific qualifications.

Branches are indicated on unit Modified Tables of Organization & Equipment (MTOE) or Table of Distribution & Allowances (TDA). There must be a vacant, branch specific, position available in order to be commissioned in that branch.
