The Minnesota Army National Guard offers direct commissions in specialty branches to highly qualified individuals who have acquired special skills through education and employment. There are also a number of [financial incentive programs](#) available to medical professionals, including physician assistants.

If criteria are met, an application packet for medical, dental, and chaplain candidates is assembled by the Officer Specialty Branch, Minnesota Army National Guard Recruiting Command.

Packets are forwarded through military channels to the "branch specific approval authority" for review and consideration. This review process takes approximately 3-6 months from date of application.
