



More than 600 Soldiers and Airmen are conducting flood fight operations in the Red River Valley, and are prepared to stand up additional forces if necessary.

Minnesota National Guard *by county*

Clay County: 334 personnel and 118 vehicles



Clay County Task Force is currently prepared for Quick Reaction Force (QRF) operations consisting of two reaction forces equipped with capabilities to respond to citizen evacuation and dike breaches. Roving patrols and pump monitoring operations are ongoing in Moorhead. Military trucks are staged with sandbags in preparation for sandbagging crews. Pump refueling and monitoring operations continue in Oakport. Generators are on stand-by. Presence patrols are assisting local law enforcement. Four soldiers located in Detroit Lakes have been released from active duty.

Norman County: 83 personnel and 21 vehicles



Norman County Task Force has completed all dike operations and is monitoring water levels. Route observation patrols continue.

Polk County: 69 personnel, 16 vehicles



Polk County Task Force is conducting three route observation patrols. Overland flooding continues to be the primary issue with flooding moving from east to west.

Marshall County: 16 personnel, 4 vehicles

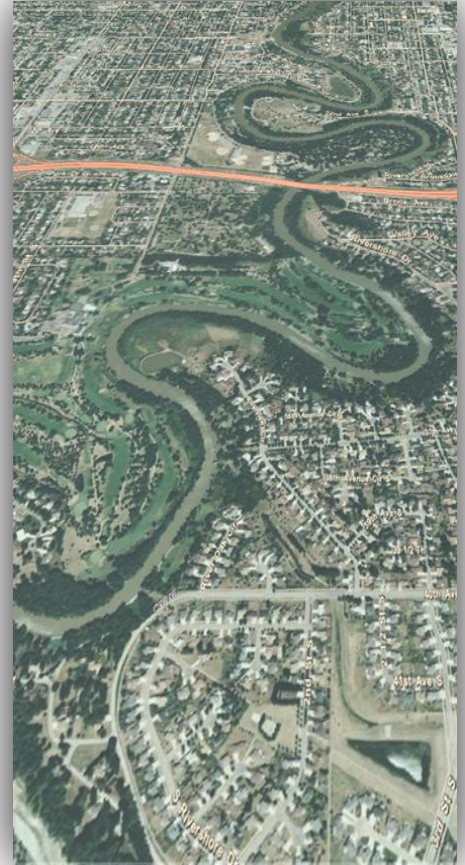


Marshall County Task Force conducted dike monitoring patrols and traffic control checkpoints in the city of Oslo.

Kittson County: 8 personnel, 4 vehicles



Kittson County Task Force has moved from Crookston to Hallock and is currently staged for operations throughout Kittson County.

Minnesota National Guard **in the next 24 hours**

The 2nd Combined Arms Battalion, 136th Infantry Regiment, or 2-136 IN (CAB), continues to support **Clay County** with a Quick Reaction Force (QRF) consisting of two reaction forces equipped with capabilities to respond to citizen evacuation and dike breaches. Observation patrols continue in Moorhead. Pump refueling and monitoring operations continue in Oakport.

Soldiers from 2-136 IN (CAB) will continue to support **Norman County** with dike patrols and the monitoring and securing of pumps within the cities of Perly, Hendrum and Halstad.

Soldiers from 2-136 IN (CAB) will continue to support **Polk County** and is providing route reconnaissance over 62 miles of Polk County. A Joint Communications Platform (JCP) trailer is staged in Crookston for potential communications back up. The task force continues sand bag site security in the city of East Grand Forks.

Soldiers from 2-136 IN (CAB) will continue to support **Marshall County** by conducting dike patrols and traffic control points in the city of Oslo.

Airmen from both the 133rd Airlift Wing and 148th Fighter Wing will continue to support the flood fight with specialized Joint Communications Platform (JCP) trailers in Crookston and Moorhead.
