Taliban claims missing soldier

A Taliban commander in Afghanistan claims that a missing U.S. soldier is being held unharmed by insurgents, Reuters reported. Mawlawi Sangin accused the U.S. military of harassing and arresting Afghans in the southeastern provinces, and threatened to kill the soldier if these actions did not cease. The U.S. military said the soldier has been missing since late June and was presumed captured.


Weather

During the exercise, the Soldiers will be exposed to many different situations and scenarios to test their ability to communicate with each section in the TOC, and to test current measures that will shape procedures for future exercises and operations.

The exercise first began in May, when the HHC Soldiers began to familiarize with equipment and software that will be used in the exercise. The early obstacles, Olson said, were deciding how the command would organize distribution lists and file, store and log e-mail message documents.

After brushing off the dust in May, the Soldiers built the TOC in a day and a half, which is an improvement from prior exercises. However, Olson said they are already identifying changes that will allow the Soldiers to set up the TOC faster and make things run more efficiently.

“We are working with a young, inexperienced staff,” said Olson, “but they are working hard and doing an outstanding job.”
