Soldiers of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1st Brigade Combat Team, began their annual training with a bang by achieving 96% rifle qualification rate at Camp Ripley's "A" Range Complex.

The rifle qualification was the first event on the two-week training schedule. In addition to the rifle qualification, the company achieved 100% qualification rate with the night firing and Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical ranges as well. Although the company doesn't train like this often, Capt. Scott Abram, HHC's commanding officer, knew the company would do well.

love doing this, and they always impress me."

At the end of the day, HHC boasted 34 rifle marksmen, 28 rifle sharpshooters, and 7 rifle experts. The scores ranged from a qualifying score of 23 to a near perfect score of 38.

"That's what impresses me about this battalion," said Abram. "We don't get out to do stuff like this very often, but when we do, we do it extremely well."

The company will continue to hone their skills in Army Warrior Tasks for the next few days, then shift to working with real-world exercises.
