



## Maintenance Supervisor (63X)

Solid, dependable leadership is crucial to success of any organization, and the U.S. Army is no exception. The Vehicle Maintenance Supervisor supervises, plans, coordinates, and directs the unit, direct support and general support maintenance of all tracked and wheeled vehicles and construction equipment.

Additional responsibilities may include:

- Ensuring the proper communications between subordinates and superiors.

- Providing tactical and technical guidance to subordinates and professional support to both subordinates and superiors in accomplishment of their duties.

- Supervising and performing field and sustainment maintenance.

- Supervising recovery operations on track vehicles, wheel vehicles and related activities including electrical wiring harness system repair/maintenance.

The following are required:

- Completion of the Basic Noncommissioned Officer Course (BNCOC)

- Completion of the Advanced Noncommissioned Officer Course (ANCO)

- 12-18 years of service on average

### **TRAINING**

Vehicle Maintenance Supervisor's training includes completion of the Noncommissioned officer courses. These courses include subjects on writing, communication, computers, environmental awareness, outlines, management, military history and MOS-specific leadership lessons.

### **HELPFUL SKILLS**

Being a leader in the Army requires certain qualities. A leader exhibits self-discipline, initiative, confidence and intelligence. They are physically fit and can perform under physical and mental pressures. Leaders make decisions quickly, always focusing on completing the mission successfully, and showing respect for their subordinates and other military officers. Leaders lead from

the front and adjust to environments that are always changing. They are judged by their ability to make decisions on their own and bear ultimate moral responsibility for those decisions.

The skills you learn as a Vehicle Maintenance Supervisor will help prepare you for a future with auto and construction equipment dealers and farm equipment companies. You'll be able to pursue a career such as a first line Supervisor or manager of mechanics, installers and repairers.

The leadership skills you acquire as a Vehicle Maintenance Supervisor will help you in many types of civilian careers. A Vehicle Maintenance Supervisor in the Army is most closely related to a vital manager in a corporation.
